Promises Made, Promises Kept: Biden's Accomplishments for IBEW Members

Legislation

- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law
 - Provides **\$1.2 trillion in infrastructure investments**; **\$550 billion in new spending**
 - Provides **\$7.5B in federal investment in public EV charging infrastructure** with strong workforce standards
 - Includes the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program (EVITP) standard: The IBEW has more than 23,000 EVITP-certified members in the United States, with more in the pipeline
 - Biden has made clear time and again that IBEW members will build
 500,000 EV chargers across the country
- Inflation Reduction Act of 2022
 - Creates work opportunities for tens of thousands of IBEW members across the energy economy
 - **Expands IBEW membership** in traditional and renewable power generation, construction, and manufacturing
 - Includes strong **labor protections in over \$300 billion in tax credits** for clean energy infrastructure projects
 - Provides penalties with teeth: **\$10,000 penalty per worker** plus interest for intentionally violating prevailing wage requirements on clean energy tax credits
- CHIPS and Science Act
 - Incentivizes production of critical computer chips and building of semiconductor plants which creates more jobs for IBEW construction and manufacturing members
 - Allocates \$52.7 billion to support domestic semiconductor ("chip") manufacturing through financial assistance for the construction of chips facilities, research and development (R&D), workforce education programs, and more
 - Grants **\$67.9 billion** to the Department of Energy (DOE) for **research and programs related to energy security, microelectronics, nuclear technologies, and more**



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- American Rescue Plan Act
 - Provided pandemic relief
 - Funded transit system partial projects that continue to employ IBEW members
 - Saved union pensions, like the IBEW's, with the Butch Lewis Act
 - Included \$200 million in new funding for the agencies that enforce worker protection laws, such as the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Wage and Hour Division, and the Office of Workers' Compensation Programs
- Supports the Protecting the Right to Organize (PRO) Act
 - The administration strongly supports this pro-worker, pro-union legislation
 - This legislation would expand and protect employees' rights to form a union and collectively bargain with employers
- Supports the National Apprenticeship Act.
 - The administration supports this legislation which calls for rebuilding America's infrastructure using diverse, local, well-trained workers with the free and fair choice to join a union. This starts by expanding registered apprenticeship programs and the pipelines into them.
 - Would create nearly 1 million new Registered Apprenticeship, youth apprenticeship, and pre-apprenticeship opportunities over the next 5 years by investing \$3.8 billion
 - Modernizes apprenticeship standards and requirements, expands registered apprenticeships to new industries, provides support for youth apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeship programs

Executive Orders

- Biden has signed 7 executive orders strengthening workers' rights and job security
 - **Project Labor Agreements** on large-scale federal construction projects
 - **Justice40** directs federal agencies to ensure that at least 40% of certain federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities
 - Directs a government-wide approach to the climate crisis that creates well-paying *union* jobs to build modern and sustainable infrastructure and deliver an equitable renewable energy future.
 - Increased the **minimum wage for federal contractors**



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- Signed 2 executive orders focused on encouraging domestic supply chains
 - Strengthened Buy American Provisions
 - Launched sweeping review on America's Supply Chains
- Directed the federal government to mobilize its policies, programs, and practices to empower workers to organize and successfully bargain with their employers
- Helped re-industrialize and revitalize coal communities
 - Created the Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization
- Rescinded executive orders and rules by the former administration that threatened IBEW and other labor unions
 - **Rescinded** the prior administration's order that tried to create industry-recognized apprenticeship programs (IRAPs) which **threatened registered apprenticeship programs like IBEW's**
 - Rescinded the prior administration's order to gut federal employee unions
 - Withdrew the prior administration's rule that curtailed efforts to combat federal workplace discrimination
 - Withdrew the prior administration's rule that would make it easier for employers to misclassify employees as independent contractors

Appointments and Nominations

- 6 days into his administration, Biden booted out the prior administration's anti-union NLRB lawyers and appointed NLRB lawyers with strong records of protecting workers' rights
- Biden has nominated and **appointed at least 18 pro-union officials** to key labor-related positions, including IBEW members:
 - Jennifer Kropke, Director of Energy Jobs, U.S. Department of Energy: Los Angeles IBEW Local 11 member.
 - **Robert P. "Bobby" Klein**, *Member, Board of Directors Tennessee Valley Authority*: Retired Tenth District IBEW International Vice President.
